Philadelphia Health Department Update - Measles Outbreak

The Philadelphia Health Department reports a total of 5 confirmed and 3 presumed cases of measles associated with this outbreak. Currently, 3 of these cases are hospitalized with measles. The Health Department is <u>posting regular updates on the City's website</u>. Check for the latest.

The Health Department has announced that all City Health Centers have the MMR vaccine which can protect you from measles. Any child in Philadelphia can receive free vaccines at City Health Centers. Call Center Operators can be reached at 215-685-2933 to set up an appointment.

For a limited time, Health Center 3 (555 S 43rd St.), Health Center 4 (4400 Haverford Ave.), and Health Center 5 (1900 N 20th St.) are also offering walk-in MMR vaccinations to any Philadelphia resident, Monday through Thursday 10am -12noon and 1p-3p.

All of these vaccines are free at the City Health Centers. There is no need for an ID, just a piece of mail with your address on it will confirm your residency.
